





## CHILDREN'S INTERESTS AND NATURAL CURIOSITY FOR THE WORLD ARE USED AS SPRINGBOARDS TO LEARNING, AS STAFF INTERACT WITH CHILDREN INDIVIDUALLY.

Nurturing the spiritual, social, physical, emotional, cognitive and creative development of children is of paramount importance in the early years.

We are blessed that our Centre is wonderfully run by caring Christian teachers who are mature, experienced and committed to the profession of early-childhood education. Recognised as our most valuable asset, they create a warm and nurturing environment where children feel secure and loved.

Our teachers create engaging educational programs developed to align with the Early Years Framework (EYLF) and foster learning in a play-based environment. The individualised approach allows each child to be supported to meet developmental milestones through a range of planned and spontaneous indoor and outdoor activities. Staff actively assist children in becoming independent, self-confident and inquisitive learners.

### Kindergarten (4 - 5 year olds)

#### Get Ready for Prep

- The Queensland Government Approved Kindergarten program operates 5 days per week with options for a 5-day fortnight, full-time or flexible arrangements. There are two options for Kindergarten:  
*Option 1 - Kindy Plus* Hours of operation for Kindy Plus are 6:45 am to 5:45 pm, 40 weeks of the year  
*Option 2 - Kindergarten* Daily program running from 7:30 am to 3:15 pm, 40 weeks of the year
- Weekly specialist lessons
- Visits with specialist teachers
- Bush Kindy program
- Beach Kindy program
- Reading Eggs
- Pre-Kindergarten is available during school holidays for Kindergarten children needing care. This is available for 10 weeks during school breaks

## JUNIOR PRIMARY

*In these critical foundation years, we focus on the establishment of a strong literacy and numeracy base, development of effective social skills and a love of learning.*

Students are nurtured within their own precinct which provides a safe, supportive environment in which to learn and flourish. Students also engage in a range of experiences in our specialist performing arts lessons, a tailored physical education program, instruction in languages other than English, visual arts and media, Chapel and design technologies. Junior Primary is an excellent foundation and launch pad for all future learning.

## UPPER PRIMARY

*In Upper Primary we provide a balanced curriculum which is enhanced by co-curricular programs for students as they continue on their educational journey.*

Building on academic and social skills learnt in Junior Primary, our students further develop their literacy and numeracy skills, participate in fun and engaging physical activities, express themselves through the performing arts and become equipped with practical, hands-on IT skills. Students are immersed in a leadership development program to grow their Christian character and learn to lead by example to younger students.



Learning is well-supported and enhanced through an extensive array of contemporary IT resources, with students utilising banks of notebook computers, interactive whiteboards and iPads within their classroom. Classes benefit from our generous adult/child ratios, ensuring that our students are well-positioned for life in the 21st Century.

# THIS IS MY Middle SCHOOL

*Becoming an adult is arguably more challenging today than ever before. To thrive in our rapidly changing world, students must gain 21st-century skills and a strong sense of identity. At Suncoast, our Middle Years (7-9) program provides in-depth knowledge in a wide range of subjects to assist in their journey of self-discovery and preparation for the Senior Years and adult life to come.*

## **CURRICULUM**

The Middle Years (7-9) is a time where students' creativity, energy, and level of interest are exploding, and this is where we seek to make learning both engaging and fun.

Students study English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Christian Studies, and Health and Physical Education as core subjects. Middle Years learning also focuses on encouraging students (via electives) to



negotiate the curriculum according to their interests, gifts, and passions. Electives across the Middle Years may include: Digital Technologies, Art, Drama, Dance, Music, Design Technologies, Food & Textile Technologies, Business & Economics and Media.

#### **LAPTOP PROGRAM**

All Secondary students participate in the 1:1 Laptop Program, equipped with a computer for use at home and school.

#### **CO-CURRICULUM**

Middle Years students participate in a variety of experiences that help educate the whole person. Opportunities abound

through sport, Chapel, camps, academic competitions, music programs, community service, and leadership development.

Co-Curricular opportunities include: debating, camps, Chess Club, Robotics Club, Public Speaking, community gardening, Student Representative Council and Student Leadership Programs, National English, Mathematics and Information Technology Competitions, in-house event catering opportunities for Hospitality students, Middle Years Chapel Band, Years 7 and 8 Band, Dance Development Company, Junior Vocal Squad (JVS).

*Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS) at Suncoast Christian College provides students with great pathways into the workforce and further education.*

Vocational Education and Training in Schools is learning that directly relates to the world of employment. It is a learning pathway available to young people in Senior Secondary, that provides students with the opportunity to engage in education and training which may lead to employment and/or further study.

Successful completion of VETiS qualifications provides credit towards the Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). These nationally recognised qualifications can also contribute to an ATAR.

**Benefits of participating in VETiS include (but are not limited to):**

- obtaining practical experience from work.
- gaining familiarity with how workplaces operate.
- developing employability skills.
- developing and improving interpersonal skills.
- allowing students to explore the potential career path they would like to pursue.
- possible contribution to an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).




Suncoast focuses on promoting creative integrity, personal discipline and building community through our major performing and visual arts events all within the framework of our Faith.


SunArts is a comprehensive and progressive extra-curricular performing arts program offering specialist dance, drama and music lessons for students from beginner to advanced levels.

Within the SunArts Program, Primary and Secondary students can pursue their love of music and other performing arts by participating in individual or shared lessons. For students in the SunArts Instrumental Program, there are flexible instrument hire arrangements available.

In addition to the instrumental lessons, SunArts extends the scope of tuition in the Performing Arts to Dance and Drama classes. These classes are quite extensive and cover multiple disciplines.

External dance classes provide training in Ballet, Jazz, Contemporary and Acro. These classes are held weekday afternoons and can extend to Saturday mornings. Students from Prep to Year 12 can enjoy classes in Drama and Acting, Production and Musical Theatre. Within Production classes, students experience real-world auditions - an integral part of life in the performing arts.

Performance is a vital aspect of a student's musical education, and there are many opportunities at Suncoast where students can develop these skills. Our goal is to share your child's journey in mastering an instrument while also encouraging confidence-building live performance opportunities.


