Some Interesting Facts

Thailand is situated in middle Asia and borders Myanmar, Laos, Cambodia & Malaysia. Thailand means 'land of the free' and is home to 70 million people.

The Chiang Mai region consists mainly of mountainous terrain and fertile valleys. It is hot and humid all year round. Seasonal rains called monsoons occur mainly between July and October.

The 2004 tsunami hurtled a wall of water 30 feet high over Thailand's coast, killing over 8,000 people. An estimated 1,500 Thai children lost their parents and more than 150,000 Thais working in the fishing or tourist industries lost their livelihoods.

Thailand is predominately Buddhist which shapes much of the way Thai people think, feel and act with 93% of the population being Buddhist. Thai people are accommodating and dislike confrontation. Chiang Mai is generally a modern city with all the benefits of western cities. Transport is basic but busy and the shopping varies from large centres to street markets and night bazaars.
